

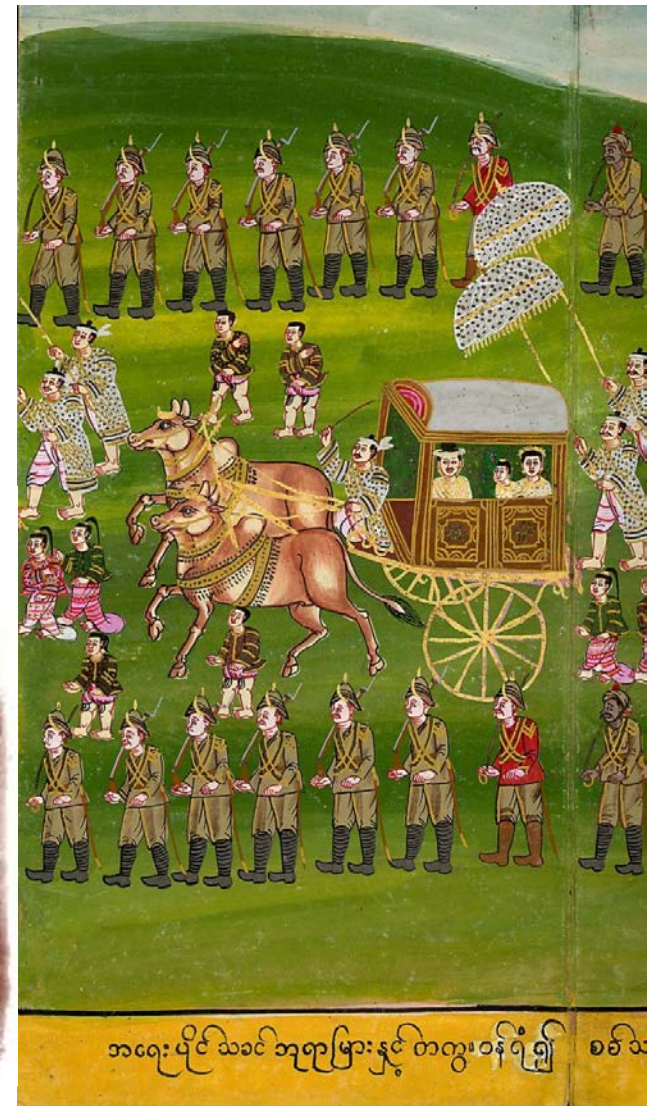

MS 2475 Deportation of King Thibaw from Burma in November 1885 Mandalay, Burma, 1886-1900

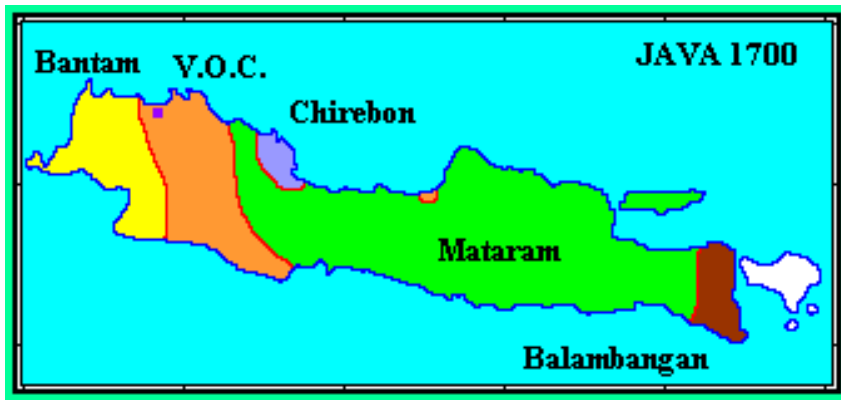
b. compromises & wars to destabilize Vietnamese monarchy

(Danang 1858)

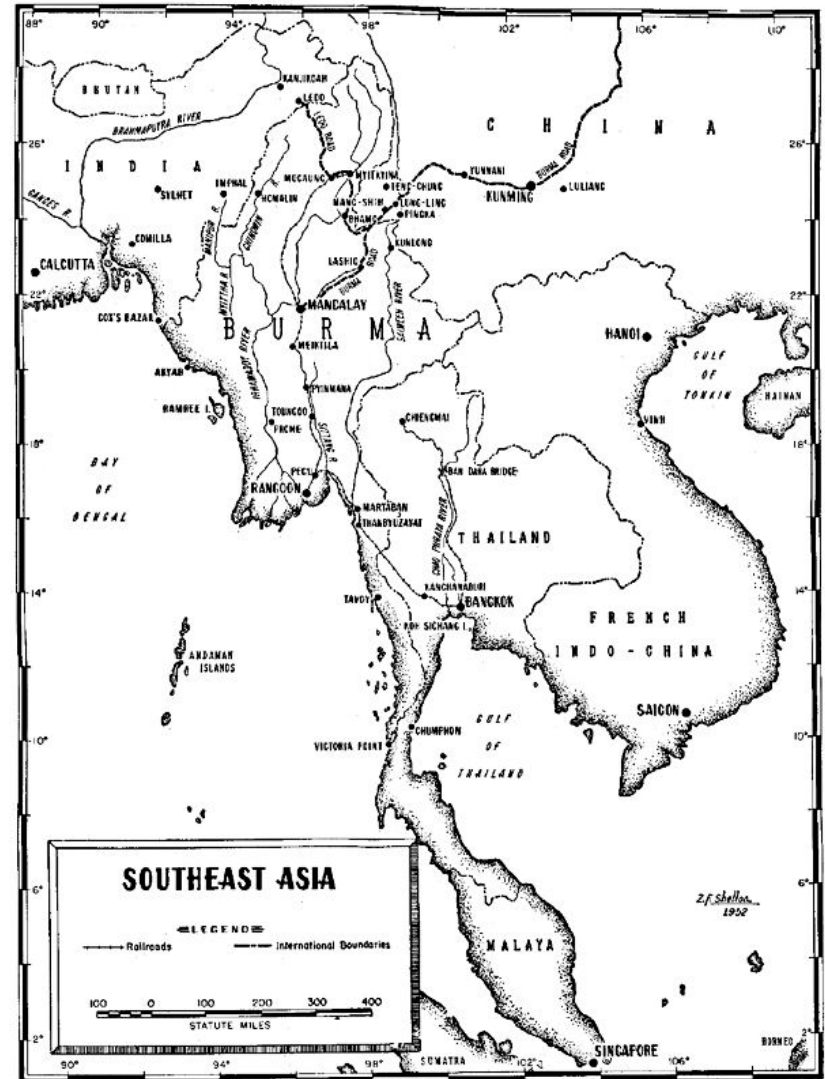
